Discover Whistler Creekside

Visitors arriving in Whistler via the Sea to Sky Highway from Vancouver will encounter Whistler Creekside before they reach the main Whistler Village, and many may recognize the area from the exposure it received during the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. Whistler Creekside was the original point of access to Whistler Mountain when it opened for skiing in 1966 and, during the 2010 Winter Games, it was where all of the Olympic and Paralympic alpine skiing events took place. Whistler Creekside provides a valuable alternative to Whistler Village not only as a convenient starting point for a day of skiing and snowboarding on the spectacular Whistler Blackcomb Mountains, but also for accommodation, dining and après.

Creekside at a Glance:

- **Accommodation** – Whistler Creekside offers a variety of lodgings to choose from, including ski-in / ski-out options. The addition of luxury accommodations within the last several years contributed to the revitalization of Whistler Creekside. A stay in this area is typically an opportunity to benefit from great

value as accommodation rates tend to be lower in Creekside than in Whistler Village.

- **Amenities** – Creekside offers dining possibilities ranging from casual to more refined, a slopeside après spot, a grocery store, its own gondola and more.
- **Skiing and Snowboarding** – The world record-breaking PEAK 2 PEAK Gondola connects Whistler Mountain with Blackcomb Mountain, so access to the diverse skiing and snowboarding terrain on both mountains is accessible from Whistler Creekside via Whistler Blackcomb's lift system. Whistler Blackcomb has a Creekside location for lift ticket purchase, children's ski and snowboard lessons, and equipment rental.
